APPLICATION GUIDELINES JAPANESE GOVERNMENT (MEXT) SCHOLARSHIP FOR 2019 (UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS)

The Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT) of Japan offers scholarships to international students who wish to study at Japanese universities as Undergraduate Students under the Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarship Program as follows.

1. DEFINITION OF "UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS"

Those who are enrolled in an undergraduate course at a university, or who are receiving preparatory education in the Japanese language and other subjects prior to placement at the university.

2. FIELDS OF STUDY

Those who apply for an undergraduate student must choose a "Field of Study ("Social Sciences and Humanities" or "Natural Sciences"), "Course", and "Major(s)" from the below table. Applicants may enter a first, second, and third choice.

(Note) An applicant who chooses Natural Sciences and would like to choose more than one majors is required to select up to three majors from within the same course (i.e. Natural Sciences A, B or C). However, an applicant who selects Natural Science - C as his/her first choice may choose his/her second-choice major from Natural Science - B or C and third-choice major from Natural Science - B as Natural Science - C offers only two majors.

3. PREPARATORY EDUCATION AND STUDY AT UNIVERSITY

(1) Preparatory Education

- (1) Each grantee will be enrolled at a preparatory educational institution (either at the Tokyo University of Foreign Studies or Osaka University) designated by MEXT for the first year of the scholarship period. The preparatory course is a one-year intensive course in the Japanese language and other subjects necessary for preparation for proceeding to university. Its curriculum mainly consists of education in the Japanese language, and includes other subjects such as Japanese affairs, mathematics, English, and social studies for those majoring in Social Science and Humanities, and physics, chemistry and biology for those majoring in Natural Sciences.
- ② A grantee who has completed the preparatory education will go on to a university designated by MEXT upon passing its entrance examination undertaken by the university. If a grantee is determined to be incapable of completing the preparatory course, his/her scholarship will be stopped and will be required to return to his/her home country. In such cases, expenses for the return to the home country will not be paid by MEXT.

(2) University Education

- (1) The university which a grantee will enter will be decided by MEXT in consultation with the university and the preparatory educational institution and in comprehensive consideration of the results of the academic examinations in the First Screening conducted at the Japanese Embassy or Consultae (hereinafter referred to "Japanese diplomatic mission") in the country of applicant's nationality, academic achievement at the preparatory educational institution, the grantee's proposed major subject, and the receiving capacity of the university. No objection by the grantee against the decision will be allowed.
- (2) In principle, the academic year begins on April 1 each year and ends on March 31 the following year.
- (3) All classes will be given in the Japanese language (except where a grantee is directly placed at a university which requires no Japanese language ability).
- (4) If a grantee attends the designated university for the prescribed number of years and earns the required number of credits as determined by the university, he/she will be awarded a Bachelor's Degree.
- (3) Change of Field of Study and Subjects to be Studied: A grantee will not be permitted to change his/her course (Social Sciences and Humanities A and B, and Natural Sciences A, B, and C). A grantee must study compulsory subjects as determined by the preparatory educational institution and the university even if he/she has already studied them at a university outside Japan.

4. DIRECT PLACEMENT

- (1) Applicants who have sufficient Japanese language proficiency may choose to enroll directly in their university without taking the preparatory education course. For cases where the undergraduate course of a university does not require Japanese language proficiency at the time of enrollment and allows applicants to enroll without going through the preparatory education, applicants may directly enroll in the said undergraduate course. (These cases are called "direct placement".) In such cases, enrollment may be from the autumn term (grantees arrive in Japan in September or October 2019, and start from the autumn term), depending on the university.
- (2) The decision on universities for placement of applicants who desire direct placement shall be made by MEXT in consultation with the relevant university. However, in cases when acceptance for direct placement is impossible for all universities, or the accepting university has yet to be determined at the time when the consultation period expires, the offer of direct placement will be withdrawn and he/she will be enrolled at a preparatory educational institution.

5. QUALIFICATIONS AND CONDITIONS

MEXT accepts applications from international students for study in Japan who satisfy the following qualifications and conditions. Its aim is to foster human resources who will become bridges of friendship between the grantee's country and Japan through study in Japan and who will contribute to the development of both countries and the wider world.

- (1) Nationality: Applicants must have the nationality of a country that has diplomatic relations with Japan. An applicant who has Japanese nationality at the time of application is not eligible. However, persons with dual nationality who hold Japanese nationality and whose place of residence at the time of application is outside of Japan are eligible to apply as long as they choose the nationality of the other country and renounce their Japanese nationality by the date of their arrival in Japan. The First Screening must be conducted at the Japanese diplomatic mission in the country of which the applicant chooses the nationality.
- (2) Age: Applicants, in principle, must be born between April 2, 1994 and April 1, 2002. Exceptions are limited to cases in which MEXT deems that the applicant cloud not apply within the eligible age limit due to the situation or circumstances of the applicant's country (military service obligation, loss of educational opportunities due to disturbances of war, etc.) Personal circumstances (financial situation, family circumstances, state of health, circumstances related to applicant's university or place of employment, etc.) will not be considered for exceptions.
- (3) Academic Background: Applicants must satisfy any one of the following conditions. However, applicants desiring direct placement must satisfy either the following ① or ③ condition.
 - ① Applicants who have completed 12 years of schooling in countries other than Japan. (Applicants who will meet the above qualifications by March 2019 are eligible. However, applicants wishing to enroll from the autumn term through direct placement must be expected to complete 12 years of schooling by August 2019.)
 - (2) Applicants who have completed their studies at a school equivalent to a Japanese upper secondary school in countries other than Japan. (Applicants who will meet the above qualifications by March 2019 are eligible.)
 - 3 Other than the above 1 and 2 conditions, applicants who are eligible for enrollment in a Japanese university at the time of application.
- (4) Japanese Language: Applicants must be willing to learn Japanese. Applicants must be interested in Japan and be willing to deepen their understanding of Japan before and after arriving in Japan. In addition, in principle, applicants must be willing to carry out their academic studies in Japan in Japanese.
- (5) Health: Applicants must submit a health certificate in the prescribed format signed by a physician attesting that the applicant has no physical or mental conditions hindering the applicant's study in Japan.
- (6) Arrival in Japan: In principle, applicants must be able to arrive in Japan between the 1st and 7th of April 2019. Departure from the home residence should be on or after 1 April. If an applicant is to enroll in his/her university from the fall semester through direct placement, he/she must be able to arrive in Japan during the period specified by the accepting university within two weeks before and after the starting date of the university's relevant academic term for that year.
 - Excluding cases in which MEXT deems as unavoidable circumstances, the applicant must withdraw from this scholarship program if the applicant cannot arrive in Japan by the end of the specified period above.
 - If the applicant cannot arrive in Japan before the specified period (before the period between the 1st and 7th of April 2019 or before the period within two weeks before and after the starting date of the university's relevant academic term for that year) for personal reasons, travel expenses to Japan will not be paid.
- (7) Visa Requirement: An applicant shall, in principle, obtain a "Student" visa at the Japanese diplomatic mission located in the applicant's country of nationality, and enter Japan with the residence status of "Student." Accordingly, even if the applicant already has other residence status ("Permanent resident," "Long-term resident," etc.), the applicant must change it to the "Student" status and re-enter Japan. Moreover, the applicant should be aware that after expiration of the status as a MEXT Scholarship student and even if the student again applies for their original resident status of "Permanent resident" or "Long-term resident," such resident statuses might not be necessarily granted.

- (8) Non-Eligibility: Those who meets any one of the following conditions are ineligible. If identified ineligible after being selected as a scholarship student, he /she must withdraw from the scholarship.
 - 1) Those who are military personnel or military civilian employees at the time of their arrival in Japan or during the period of the payment of the scholarship;
 - (2) Those who cannot arrive in Japan by the last date of the period specified by MEXT or the accepting university;
 - 3 Those who are previous grantees of Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarship programs (including those who withdraw from the scholarship program after the arrival in Japan). It does not apply to those receiving the MEXT Honors Scholarship while studying in Japan;
 - 4 Those who are currently also applying to another program (Research Students, College of Technology Students, Specialized Training College Students programs) under the Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarship system.
 - (5) Those who are already enrolled in a Japanese university or other institution with a residence status of "Student," or who are going to be enrolled, or plan to enroll, in a Japanese university or other institution as a privately-financed international student from the time of application to the MEXT scholarship program in the applicant's country until the commencement of the period for payment of the MEXT scholarship. However, this stipulation does not apply to privately-financed international students who, even though they are enrolled, or are planning to enroll, in a Japanese university, verifiably complete their studies before the start of the scholarship payment period, return to their home country at the time of the scholarship application, and newly acquire the "Student" residence status and come to Japan;
 - (6) Those who are planning to receive scholarship money from an organization other than MEXT (including a government organization of the applicant's country) on top of the scholarship money provided by MEXT after the start of the scholarship payment period;
 - (7) Those who are expected to graduate at the time of application and cannot satisfy the qualifications and the conditions related to academic background by the deadline given;
 - (8) Holders of dual nationality at the time of application who cannot verify that they will give up Japanese nationality by the time of the arrival in Japan;
 - (9) Those who change their residence status to that of other than "Student" after their arrival in Japan.
- (9) Others: MEXT Scholarship will be granted those who are willing to contribute to mutual understanding between Japan and their home country by participating in activities at schools and communities during their study in Japan while contributing to the internationalization of Japan. They shall also make efforts to promote relations between the home country and Japan by maintaining close relations with the university attended after graduation, cooperating with the conducting of surveys and questionnaires, and cooperating with relevant projects and events conducted by the Japanese diplomatic mission after they return to their home countries.

6. PERIOD OF SCHOLARSHIP

- (1) A grantee who studies at a preparatory educational institution prior to enroll in a university: The scholarship period will last for five years from April 2019 to March 2024, including one-year preparatory education in the Japanese language and other subjects due to be provided upon arrival in Japan. For scholarship grantees majoring in medicine, dentistry, veterinary medicine or a six-year course in pharmacy, the scholarship period will be seven years until March 2026.
- (2) A grantee who enroll in a university through direct placement: The scholarship period will last for four years (or for six years for those majoring in medicine, dentistry, veterinary medicine or in a six-year course in pharmacy). The scholarship period will start from the time of enrollment in the university which the university designates.
- (Note 1) If a grantee graduates earlier or withdraws from his/her undergraduate course for early entrance to graduate school, the scholarship will be provided until his/her graduation or withdrawal.
- (Note 2) The grantees majoring a six-year course in pharmacy must undergo the "Pharmaceutical Common Achievement Tests" implemented prior to practical training. In cases when it is impossible for the grantees to fulfill the fixed standards necessary for practical training, the scholarship may be cancelled.

(3) Extension of period of scholarship

If a grantee graduates from an undergraduate course, is admitted to a master's course at a graduate school during the period of his/her scholarship and has outstanding academic achievement that meets certain criteria, he/she may have the scholarship period extended upon a successful examination by MEXT.

7. SCHOLARSHIP BENEFITS

- (1) Allowance: 117,000 yen per month. A supplemental regional allowance of 2,000 or 3,000 yen per month will be added to the monthly scholarship amount for the grantees studying or conducting research in specially designated regions. Due to the situation of the Japanese Government's budget, the amount of payment may be subject to change each fiscal year. If a grantee is absent from the university or the preparatory educational institution for an extended period, the scholarship shall be suspended for that period.
- (2) Education Fees: Fees for the entrance examination, matriculation, and tuition at universities will be paid by MEXT.

(3) Traveling Expenses

- 1) Transportation to Japan: In principle, MEXT stipulates the travel schedule and route, and provides an economy-class airline ticket for the flight from the international airport closest to the grantee's residence (in principle, the country of nationality) to Narita International Airport or to any other international airport used on the normal route to the accepting university. The grantee shall bear at his/her own expense all costs related to domestic travel from the grantee's residence to the nearest international airport, airport taxes, airport usage fees, special taxes necessary for travel, travel expenses within Japan (including airline transit costs), travel insurance expenses, carry-on luggage or unaccompanied baggage expenses, etc. The grantee shall also bear at his/her own expense travel and lodging costs incurred in a third country if the grantee must travel to a third country before coming to Japan for visa purposes because there are no Japanese diplomatic missions in his/her country. or if there are no direct flights from the grantee's country of residence to Japan. MEXT will provide an economy-class airline ticket from the grantee's country of residence to the said third country, and from the third country to Narita International Airport or to any other international airport used on the normal route to the accepting university. In principle, the address given in the space for "Your address before departure for Japan" on the application form shall be recognized as the "residence," and the airplane ticket will be arranged for a flight from the international airport nearest to that address. Except for cases when the grantee must travel to a third country to obtain a visa, MEXT will not provide an airline ticket for cases of travel to Japan from a country other than the grantee's country of residence due to the grantee's personal circumstances.
- (2) Transportation from Japan: Based on the application by the grantee, MEXT will provide an airline ticket to grantees who shall graduate the accepting university and return to the home country by the end of the final month of the period of scholarship (See "6. PERIOD OF SCHOLARSHIP") designated by MEXT. MEXT, in principle, shall provide an economy-class airline ticket from Narita International Airport or the international airport used for the normal route to and from the accepting university to the international airport (in principle, in the country of nationality) nearest to the returning recipient's residence. The grantee shall bear at his/her own expense all costs related to travel from the grantee's residence in Japan to the nearest international airport, airport taxes, airport usage fees, special taxes necessary for travel, travel expenses within the country of nationality (including airline transit costs), travel insurance expenses, carry-on luggage or unaccompanied baggage expenses, etc.

If a grantee returns to the home country before the end of period of scholarship due to personal circumstances, or reasons stated in "8. SUSPENSION OF PAYMENT OF SCHOLARSHIP", MEXT will not pay for the returning travel expenses.

If a grantee continues to stay in Japan after the scholarship period has ended in cases such as proceeding to further education or being employed in Japan, he/she will not be paid travel expenses for a temporary return.

8. SUSPENSION OF PAYMENT OF SCHOLARSHIP

Payment of the scholarship will be stopped for the reasons given below. Should any of the following reasons apply,

the grantee may be ordered to return a part of, or all of, the scholarship paid up to that time. Payment of the scholarship may also be stopped during the period up to the decision on the disposition of the matter.

- (1) A grantee is determined to have made a false statement on his/her application;
- 2) A grantee violates any article of his/her pledge to the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology;
- (3) A grantee violates any Japanese laws and is sentenced and imprisoned for an indefinite period or for a period of exceeding 1 year;
- (4) A grantee is suspended from his/her university or preparatory educational institution or receives other punishment, or is removed from enrollment; as a disciplinary action in accordance with school regulations of the accepting institution;
- (5) It has been determined that it will be impossible for a grantee to complete the course within the standard time period because of poor academic grades or suspension or absence from the university or preparatory educational institution;
- (6) A grantee came to Japan without newly acquiring the "Student" residence status, or changed his/her residence status to one other than "Student";
- (7) A grantee has received another scholarship (excluding those specified for research expenditures);
- (8) A grantee proceeds to a more advanced level of education without receiving approval for an extension of the period of the scholarship.

9. SELECTION

- (1) The Japanese diplomatic missions will conduct the First Screening of applicants by means of examination of submitted application documents, written academic examinations and interviews.
 - 1 Subjects of Written Academic Examinations (to be undertaken by all applicants)

- (2) Calculators and other devices may not be used during the written examinations.
- (2) The date and time of the notification of the results of the First Screening will be specified separately by the Japanese diplomatic mission in the applicant's country; the reasons for the results of the screening will not be disclosed. Those who pass the First Screening will not necessarily be selected as the MEXT Scholarship grantees.
- (3) Applicants who have passed the First Screening will be recommended to MEXT. MEXT will then conduct the Second Screening of the recommended applicants and decide the scholarship grantees. MEXT selects candidates from each field of study.
- (4) Applicants will be informed of the final selection results by the Japanese diplomatic mission in the applicant's country by the end of January of the year of arrival in Japan. The reasons for the results will not be disclosed. Ay objections to the decision on the university of placement will not be accepted.

10. APPLICATION DOCUMENTS

Applicants must submit the following documents to the Japanese diplomatic mission in the applicant's country by the designated deadline. The submitted documents will not be returned.

- (Note 1) Documents indicated by the white circle (o) must be submitted by all the applicants. Documents indicated by the black circle (o) should be submitted only if applicable.
- (Note 2) These documents must be written in Japanese or English, or translation in either of these languages should be attached.
- (Note 3) The applicants must submit two application packets: one is a complete set of original documents and the other is a complete set of their copies. Write the document number, from 1 to 9 (refer to the numbers in the table above) in the upper right-hand corner of the first page for all the documents.
- (Note 4) The applicant's photograph to be attached to the Application Form should be of clear quality, taken within six months of submission, and printed on paper specially for photographs. The photograph should be 4.5 x 3.5 cm., upper-body, full-faced, no hats. Please write applicant's name and nationality on the back of the photograph. The photograph data can be pasted to the Application Form and printed out.
- (Note 5) A list of undergraduate courses permitting direct placement is provided by the Japanese diplomatic mission in the applicant's country. Applicants desiring direct placement should choose and fill in their preferred university and department in the Preference Form out of the list. Prior to the submission of the Form, applicants should inquire the Japanese diplomatic mission about and understand the undergraduate courses accepting direct placement, the number of students accepted, any conditions for acceptance including Japanese language proficiency, information on any entrance examinations conducted by the university, the period when overseas students may enroll and start their studies, etc.
- (Note 6) The academic transcripts of the last school attended should show the grade scale applied and the grades earned by the applicant in all the subjects studied for each year of study at the school. In the case that the last school offers a single-structure education system consisting of a lower and upper secondary level or a primary and secondary level, the necessary academic transcripts to be submitted shall cover all school years of upper secondary education.
- (Note 7) A copy of the graduation certificate or the degree certificate obtained from the last school attended and the certificate of university enrollment qualification examination is acceptable if the copy is attested by an authorized official of the university or an examination authority. Do not submit the originals as submitted certificates will not be returned.
- (Note 8) For applicants with "8 Certificate of university entrance qualification examination", this document may be submitted in place of documents No. (3) (4) and (5)
- (Note 9) If printing out the certificates from the Internet, print out and submit a page showing the applicant's name and the details of the relevant qualification (level, score, etc.).

11. NOTES

- (1) The grantees are advised to learn, before departing for Japan, the Japanese language and to acquire information about Japanese weather, climate, customs, university education, and conditions of the university to attend in Japan, as well as about the difference between the Japanese legal system and that of his/her home country.
- (2) As the first installment of the scholarship payment will be made from one month to one and a half months after the grantee's arrival in Japan, the grantee is recommended to bring at least approximately US\$2,000 with him/her to Japan to cover immediate living expenses and other necessary expenses.
- (3) The scholarship payments will be transferred to the bank account opened by each grantee after the arrival in Japan. The bank account has to be opened at a Japanese financial institution designated by MEXT.
- (4) Grantees must enroll in National Health Insurance (Kokumin Kenko Hoken) upon arrival in Japan.

(5) Accommodations:

- 1) During the period of preparatory education, grantees can reside in the residential accommodations of Tokyo University of Foreign Studies or Osaka University, depending on where they are enrolled. Expenses relating to accommodations will be borne by the grantee.
- (2) Residence halls for international students provided by universities: Some universities have residence halls for international students. The grantees enrolled at such universities may reside at these residence halls under certain conditions. However, due to the limited number of rooms, some of these facilities may be unavailable. Expenses relating to accommodations will be borne by the grantee.
- (3) Private boarding houses or apartments: Those who are unable to find accommodation in the aforementioned facilities may live in regular dormitories of the university or in private boarding houses/apartments with his/her expenses. It is difficult for grantees with dependents (spouse and children) to find appropriate housing in Japan. The grantee is requested to arrive in Japan alone first to secure housing before having his/her dependent(s) come to Japan.
- (6) Information regarding the MEXT Scholarship Students (name, gender, date of birth, nationality, accepting university/graduate school/undergraduate school, field of specialty, period of enrolment, career path after completion of scholarship, contact information [address, telephone number, e-mail address]) may be shared with other relevant government organizations for the purpose of utilization for international students programs implemented by the Japanese Government (support during period of study in Japan, follow-up survey, improvement of the international student system).

Information regarding MEXT Scholarship Students (excluding date of birth and contact information) may be included in publicity materials prepared by the Japanese Government for promoting the acceptance of international students in Japan, particularly in order to introduce former MEXT Scholarship Students who are playing active roles in countries around the world.

APPLICATION GUIDELINES JAPANESE GOVERNMENT (MEXT) SCHOLARSHIP FOR 2019

(RESEARCH STUDENTS)

The Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT) of Japan offers scholarships to international students who wish to study in graduate courses at Japanese universities as Research Students (either regular students or non-regular students) under the Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarship Program as follows.

1. DEFINITION OF "RESEARCH STUDENTS"

Those who are enrolled in a master's course, a doctoral course, or a professional graduate course at a graduate school, or who are conducting research in a specialized field at an undergraduate department, graduate school, institute attached to a university, etc. without the aim of completing the course, or who are receiving preparatory education in the Japanese language and other subjects prior to placement at the university, etc. (Excluding the Young Leaders Program students or Teacher Training Students.)

2. FIELDS OF STUDY

Applicants should apply for the field of study they majored in at university or its related field. Moreover, the fields of study must be subjects which applicants will be able to study and research in graduate courses at Japanese universities.

The fields of study may be restricted to particular fields by the Japanese Embassy/Consulate General (hereinafter referred to as the "Japanese diplomatic mission") in the applicant's country.

Traditional entertainment arts such as Kabuki and classical Japanese dances, or subjects that require practical training in specific technologies or techniques at factories or companies are not included in the fields of study under this scholarship program.

A student who studies medicine, dentistry or welfare science will not be allowed to engage in clinical training such as medical care and operative surgery until he/she obtains a relevant license from the Minister of Health, Labor and Welfare under applicable Japanese laws.

3. QUALIFICATIONS AND CONDITIONS

MEXT accepts applications from international students for study in Japan who satisfy the following qualifications and conditions. Our aim is to foster human resources who will become bridges of friendship between the grantee's country and Japan through study in Japan and who will contribute to the development of both countries and the wider world.

- (1) Nationality: Applicants must have the nationality of a country that has diplomatic relations with Japan. An applicant who has Japanese nationality at the time of application is not eligible. However, persons with dual nationality who hold Japanese nationality and whose place of residence at the time of application is outside of Japan are eligible to apply as long as they choose the nationality of the other country and renounce their Japanese nationality by the date of their arrival in Japan. The First Screening must be conducted at the Japanese diplomatic mission in the country of which the applicant chooses the nationality.
- (2) Age: Applicants, in principle, must have been born on or after April 2, 1984. Exceptions are limited to cases in which MEXT deems that the applicant could not apply within the eligible age limit due to the situation or circumstances of the applicant's country (military service obligation, loss of educational opportunities due to disturbances of war, etc.) Personal circumstances (financial situation, family circumstances, state of health, circumstances related to applicant's university or place of employment, etc.) will not be considered for exceptions.
- (3) Academic Background: Eligible applicants satisfy the qualification requirements for admission to a master's degree course or a doctoral degree course at a Japanese graduate school. (Includes applicants who are certainly expected to satisfy the requirements by the time of enrollment.)

Students must satisfy any one of the following eligibility criteria.

- 1 Master's program / Doctoral program (first phase)
- Japanese university graduates.
- Students that have been conferred their bachelor's degree through the National Institution for Academic Degrees and Quality Enhancement of Higher Education (NIAD-QE).
- 3 Students who have completed 16 years of school education in countries other than Japan.
- Students who have completed a program with the standard study period of three years or more at universities or equivalent educational institutions in countries other than Japan and received a degree equivalent to a bachelor's degree.
- Students who have completed 16 years of education at education institutions in Japan recognized as having overseas undergraduate programs.
- Students who have completed designated professional training college courses.
- Tstudents recognized as having academic abilities equivalent to or better than university graduates in an individual entrance qualification examination conducted by a graduate school, and who have reached 22 years of age.

2 Doctoral program (second phase)

① Students with a Japanese master's degree or students with a Japanese professional degree.

Students who have been awarded with an overseas degree equivalent to a master's degree or professional degree.

3 Students who have completed graduate programs at education institutions in Japan recognized as having overseas graduate programs and who have obtained a degree equivalent to a master's degree or professional degree.

② Students who have graduated from universities and have been involved in research study at universities or research centers (including overseas universities and research centers) for two years or more, and recognized as having academic competency equivalent to persons with a master's degree by the graduate school.

Students recognized as having academic abilities equivalent to or better than master's degree or professional degree holders in an individual entrance qualification examination conducted by the graduate school, and who have reached 24 years of age.

3 Doctoral program (faculties of medicine, dentistry, veterinary sciences and certain pharmaceutical programs)
If you apply to a program in medicine, dentistry, veterinary medicine or certain pharmaceutical sciences, you are required to confirm directly with the school of your choice before applying.

(4) Japanese Language Ability: Applicants must be willing to learn Japanese. Applicants must be interested in Japan and be willing to deepen their understanding of Japan after arriving in Japan. Applicants must also have the ability to do research and adapt to living in Japan.

(5) Health: Applicants must submit a health certificate in the prescribed format signed by a physician attesting that the applicant has no physical or mental conditions hindering the applicant's study in Japan.

(6) Arrival in Japan: An applicant must choose and fill in in the Application Form either of the arrival periods specified below. In principle, a change in the arrival period is not permitted after the submission of the Application. If the applicant cannot arrive in Japan specified period below for personal reasons, travel expenses to Japan will not be paid. Excluding cases of unavoidable circumstances, the applicant must withdraw from this scholarship program if the applicant cannot arrive in Japan by the end of the designated period.

① April term: The arrival date should be, in principle, during the period from 1 April to 7 April, 2019. Departure from the home residence should be on or after 1 April.

② October term: The arrival date specified by the accepting university during the period within two weeks before the starting date of the relevant academic term (September or October) for that year set by the accepting university.

(7) Visa Requirement: An applicant shall, in principle, obtain a "Student" visa at the Japanese diplomatic mission located in the applicant's country of nationality, and enter Japan with the residence status of "Student." Accordingly, even if the applicant already has other residence status ("Permanent resident," "Long-term resident," etc.), the applicant must change it to the "Student" status and re-enter Japan. Moreover, the applicant should be aware that after expiration of the status as a MEXT Scholarship student and even if the student again applies for their original resident status of "Permanent resident" or "Long-term resident," the such resident statuses might not be necessarily granted.

(8) Non-eligibility: those who meet any one of the following conditions are ineligible. If identified ineligible after being selected as a scholarship student, he /she must withdraw from the scholarship.

① Those who are military personnel or military civilian employees at the time of their arrival in Japan or during the period of the payment of the scholarship;

Those who cannot arrive in Japan by the period designated by MEXT or the accepting university;

Those who are previous grantees of Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarship programs (including those who withdraw from the scholarship program after the arrival in Japan), but does not have educational research experience exceeding more than three years from the month following the final payment of the previous scholarship to the month when the payment of this scholarship begins. This does not apply to the past grantees of Japanese Studies scholarship nor Japan-Korea Joint Government Scholarship Program for the Students in Science and Engineering Departments who have graduated or are going to graduate from universities in their home countries and past participants in the Young Leaders Program. The MEXT Honors Scholarship is not one of the MEXT Scholarship Programs;

Those who are already enrolled in a Japanese university with a residence status of "Student," or who are going to be enrolled, or plan to enroll, in a Japanese university as a privately-financed international student from the time of application to the MEXT scholarship program in the their home country until the commencement of the period for payment of the MEXT scholarship. However, this stipulation does not apply to privately-financed international students who, even though they are enrolled, or are planning to enroll, in a Japanese university, verifiably complete their studies before the start of the scholarship payment period, return to their home country at the time of the scholarship application, and newly acquire the "Student" residence status and come to Japan;

Those who are planning to receive scholarship money from an organization other than MEXT (including a government organization of their home country) on top of the scholarship money provided by MEXT after the start of the scholarship payment period;

6 Those who are expected to graduate at the time of application and cannot satisfy the qualifications and the conditions related to academic background by the deadline given;

Tholders of dual nationality at the time of application who cannot verify that they will give up Japanese nationality by the time of the arrival in Japan; or

Those who change their residence status to that of other than "Student" after their arrival in Japan.

Those whose main aim is to engage in fieldwork or an internship in a country other than Japan after submission of Application;

Those who have completed a doctoral course and have no intention to obtain a degree.

(9) Others: MEXT Scholarship will be granted those who are willing to contribute to mutual understanding between Japan and their home country by participating in activities at schools and communities during their study in Japan while contributing to the internationalization of Japan. They shall also make efforts to promote relations between the home country and Japan by maintaining close relations with the university attended after graduation, cooperating with the conducting of surveys and questionnaires, and cooperating with relevant projects and events conducted by Japanese diplomatic missions after they return to their home countries.

4. PERIOD OF SCHOLARSHIP

(1) Non-regular students:

- April term: maximum of two years from April 2019 until the end of March 2021.

- October term: from September or October 2019 until the end of March 2021.

In either case, the above-mentioned period of scholarship includes a 6-month period of Japanese language training for those who require such training. In cases of arrival in Japan in other months than those specified above, MEXT will decide the period of scholarship separately.

(2) Regular students enrolled in master's, doctoral, or professional graduate courses:

- Regardless of the date of arrival, the scholarship period shall be the necessary period for the completion of the regular program of the respective courses (see "12. UNIVERSITY ENROLLMENT AND ACQURING DEGREES (4) to (6)" for the standard period of study for each course). For those requiring preparatory education, a 6-month preparatory education period will be separately added.

5. EXTENSION OF PERIOD OF SCHOLARSHIP

Non-regular students wishing to advance to a regular course in a graduate school as a regular student or students wishing to proceed to a doctoral course from a master's course or a professional graduate course may apply for an evaluation screening for the extension of the scholarship period for advanced study if the students meet the prescribed standards with outstanding academic records.

Followings are other conditions to note:

Non-regular students cannot extend the scholarship period as they stay in non-regular courses.

② Students who are admitted to advanced courses without applying for and being approved by evaluation screening for extension of the scholarship period for advanced study cannot be granted extension. (In such cases, it is

possible for the student to be accepted and enrolled in advanced courses as privately-financed student.);

Non-regular students are not eligible to apply for extension of the scholarship period if they cannot proceed to a master's or a doctoral course as regular students by the end of the scholarship period. However, if they wish to enter regular courses in April 2021 and withdraws their request for returning travel expenses to their home countries, they are eligible to apply for extension of the scholarship period. Those students who enter master's or a doctoral courses in April 2021 and return to their home country within the fixed period after the expiration of the scholarship are provided an airline ticket for returning as stated in "6. SCHOLARSHIP BENEFITS (3) 2"below.

6. SCHOLARSHIP BENEFITS

(1) Allowance: The amounts listed below shall be paid depending on the course enrolled in. Due to the situation of the Japanese Government's budget, the amount of payment may be subject to change each fiscal year. The scholarship shall be cancelled if a grantee is absent from the university for an extended period.

① Students receiving preparatory education and non-regular students: 143,000 yen per month

② Regular students enrolled in master's courses or degree courses in professional graduate schools: 144,000 yen per month

③ Regular students enrolled in doctoral courses: 145,000 yen per month.

*A supplemental regional allowance of 2,000 or 3,000 yen per month will be added to the monthly scholarship amount for the grantees studying or conducting research in specially designated regions.

(2) Education fees: Fees for the entrance examination, matriculation, and tuition at universities will be paid by MEXT. The entrance examination fee will not be paid by MEXT if the grantees cannot proceed to the master's or doctoral course or cannot be admitted by the university.

(3) Traveling Expenses

① Transportation to Japan: In principle, MEXT stipulates the travel schedule and route, and provides an economy-class airline ticket for the flight from the international airport closest to the grantee's residence (in principle, the country of nationality) to Narita International Airport or to any other international airport used on the normal route to the accepting university. The grantee shall bear at his/her own expense all costs related to domestic travel from the grantee's residence to the nearest international airport, airport taxes, airport usage fees, special taxes necessary for travel, travel expenses within Japan (including airline transit costs), travel insurance expenses, carry-on luggage or unaccompanied baggage expenses, etc. The grantee shall also bear at his/her own expense travel and lodging costs incurred in a third country if the grantee must travel to a third country before coming to Japan for visa purposes because there are no Japanese diplomatic missions in his/her country, or if there are no direct flights from the grantee's country of residence to Japan. MEXT will provide an economy-class airline ticket from the grantee's country of residence to the said third country, and from the third country to Narita International Airport or to any other international airport used on the normal route to the accepting university. In principle, the address given in the space for "Residence before arrival in Japan" on the application form shall be recognized as the "residence," and the airplane ticket will be arranged for a flight from the international airport nearest to that address. Except for cases when the grantee must travel to a third country to obtain a visa, MEXT will not provide an airline ticket for cases of travel to Japan from a country other than the grantee's country of residence due to the grantee's personal circumstances.

2 Transportation from Japan: Based on the Application by the grantee, MEXT will provide an airline ticket to, grantees graduating the accepting university and returning to the home country by the end of the final month of the period of scholarship (Section 4 above) designated by MEXT. MEXT, in principle, shall provide an economy-class airline ticket from Narita International Airport or the international airport used for the normal route to and from the accepting university to the international airport (in principle, in the country of nationality) nearest to the returning grantee's residence. The grantee shall bear at his/her own expense all costs related to travel from the grantee's residence in Japan to the nearest international airport, airport taxes, airport usage fees, special taxes necessary for travel, travel expenses within the country of nationality (including airline transit costs),

travel insurance expenses, carry-on luggage or unaccompanied baggage expenses, etc.

Note 1: In principle, travel expenses to the home country are not paid if the student desiring admission in April 2021 fails to proceed, or withdraws from the course, to a regular graduate course for a degree from a non-regular student course, or to a doctoral course from a master's course or a professional graduate course, despite applying for extension of the scholarship period, as stated in "5. EXTENSION OF PERIOD OF SCHOLARSHIP 3," so please note this when applying for such an extension.

Note 2: If a grantee return to the home country before the end of period of scholarship due to personal circumstances, or reasons stated in "7. SUSPNSION OF PAYMENT OF SCHOLARSHIP", MEXT will not

pay for the returning travel expenses.

Note 3: If a grantee continues to stay in Japan after the scholarship period has ended in cases such as being employed in Japan, he/she will not be paid travel expenses for a temporary return.

7. SUSPENSION OF PAYMENT OF SCHOLARSHIP

Payment of the scholarship will be stopped for the reasons given below. Should any of the following reasons apply, the grantee may be ordered to return a part of, or all of, the scholarship paid up to that time. Payment of the scholarship may also be stopped during the period up to the decision on the disposition of the matter.

① A grantee is determined to have made a false statement on his/her application;

2 A grantee violates any article of his/her pledge to the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology;

3 A grantee violates any Japanese laws and is sentenced and imprisoned for an indefinite period or for a period exceeding 1 year;

(4) A grantee is suspended from his/her university or preparatory educational institution or receives other punishment, or is removed from enrollment; in accordance with school regulations of the accepting institution (5) It has been determined that it will be impossible for a grantee to complete the course within the standard time

period because of poor academic grades or suspension or absence from the university;

(f) A grantee came to Japan without newly acquiring the "Student" residence status, or changed his/her residence status to one other than "Student":

A grantee has received another scholarship (excluding those specified for research expenditures);

(8) A grantee proceeds to a more advanced level of education without receiving approval for an extension of the period of the scholarship.

8. FIRST SCREENING

(1) The Japanese diplomatic missions will conduct the First Screening of applicants by means of examination of submitted application documents, written examinations of language proficiency and interviews.

(2) Written examinations of language proficiency will be English and Japanese language tests. Both language examinations must be taken by all applicants.

Note 1: The result of the Japanese language examination will be used as reference data for the Japanese-language preparatory education to be provided after the grantee's arrival in Japan.

(3) The following policy will apply to each stage of screening:

① Examination of submitted application documents: Must show that the applicant's academic achievement at the university that he/she last graduated from equaled to or exceeded a certain level, and state the applicant's desired research program in a detailed and concrete manner.

2 Written examination of language proficiency: Must show that the applicant obtained scores that clears the fixed

cut-off level in either Japanese or English.

- ③ Interview: Must reveal that the applicant has a clear sense of purpose relating to his/her study in Japan and has gathered information about Japanese universities. The interview must also reveal that the applicant has sufficient Japanese or English language ability to communicate with his/her academic adviser in Japan. If the applicant desires to study a subject that requires advanced Japanese language proficiency, the interview must show that the applicant has a considerable degree of Japanese language proficiency.
- (4) The date and time of the notification of the results of the First Screening will be specified separately by the Japanese diplomatic missions in the applicant's country; the reasons for the results of the screening will not be disclosed. Those who pass the First Screening will not necessarily be selected as grantees of the MEXT Scholarship.

(5) The results of the First Screening will be used as reference for the Second Screening and the university placement.

Applicants must submit the following documents to the Japanese diplomatic missions by the designated deadline. The submitted documents will not be returned.

- Note 6: The academic transcripts of the last university attended should show the grade scale applied and the grades earned by the applicant in all the subjects studied for each year of study at a university department/faculty and graduate school. (A degree certificate or a graduation certificate simply showing the ranking of the applicant at graduation will not substitute for academic transcripts.) Those currently enrolled in a graduate school must submit their undergraduate academic transcripts at the time of application, and those will graduate from the graduate school by the time of the receipt of the MEXT scholarship, must also submit their graduate school academic transcripts.
- Note 7: A copy of the graduation certificate or the degree certificate obtained from the last university attended is acceptable if the copy is attested by an authorized official of the university. Do not submit the originals as submitted certificates will not be returned. Those currently enrolled in a graduate school must submit a certificate of expected graduation. It is not necessary to submit an undergraduate graduation certificate.
- Note 8: For abstracts of the theses, abstracts of the graduation thesis and any presented papers will be acceptable. These abstracts will be used as basic data for evaluation of the applicant's academic ability. Make sure the applicant's name is on the first page of the abstracts.
- Note 9: If printing out the certificates from the Internet, print out and submit a page showing the applicant's name and the details of the relevant qualification (level, score, etc.).

10. ACQUISITION OF ADMISSION LETTERS

- (1) The applicants who have passed the First Screening shall directly contact the Japanese universities they wish to apply to (maximum of four universities at the same time) after the notification of the First Screening results by Fri., August 24 (Japan time) in order to request the issuance of admission letters or letters of provisional acceptance as a regular or a non-regular student in graduate school, (hereinafter, admission letters.) A contact with universities requesting issuance of the admission letter made on Sat., August 25 or after is not permitted. Since Fri., August 24 is not the deadline for the universities to issue admission letters, applicants must not urge the universities for the issuance. However, applicants may confirm with the university if the scheduled time of the issuance is delayed. In addition, applicants should keep it in mind when planning to request admission letters that universities generally need one month to issue an admission letter. In order to contact universities, applicants may receive from the Japanese diplomatic mission contact information of the departments in charge of foreign students in Japanese universities and the websites to search Japanese universities and researchers.
- (2) When requesting universities for admission letters, applicants must submit directly to universities the following documents.

[Copies of the documents submitted to the Japanese diplomatic mission ("9.APPLICATION PROCEDURES") that were stamped by the mission and returned to the applicants.

Applicants must submit any other necessary documents requested by universities. <u>Do not submit items @Placement Preference Form and @Medical Certificate.</u> The documents to be submitted to universities can all be sent by e-mail, but in cases when it is difficult to access the Internet, the documents may be sent by postal mail. Please make sure documents ①, ③~⑥, ⑧~⑪ are stamped, and that all lettering and photographs are clear and legible. Please also note that if a copy of the certificate verifying passage of the First Screening is not submitted, the university cannot comply with the request to issue an admissions letter.

(3) Applicants must always report the response from the universities and submit the final Placement Preference Form based on the responses from the universities to the Japanese diplomatic mission by the specified deadline. It is not allowed to list in the Placement Preference Form the names of universities that have declined the applicant's request.

(4) Applicants should confirm carefully with the universities the period of arrival in Japan specified in admission letters issued because it is not permitted, in principle, to change the specified period of arrival even if the applicants have stated in their Application Forms that they were able to arrive in either for the April term or the October term.

II. SECOND SCREENING AND UNIVERSITY PLACEMENT

(1) MEXT conducts the Second Screening based on the results of the First Screening conducted by the Japanese diplomatic mission in the applicant's country, and selects the applicants as the MEXT Scholarship Students as long as their placement to universities have been decided. An application may be rejected if it arouses concern over proliferation of weapons of mass destruction (WMD) and related items, e.g. a case where it is highly possible that the applicant will receive the technology that is controlled pursuant to United Nations Security Council resolutions, or that any WMD-related technologies will be transferred to an applicant who belongs to (an) organization(s) on the End User

List publicated by the Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry of Japan.

(2) An applicant who successfully passes the Second Screening will, in principle, be placed at the university from which the applicant has received an admission letter. MEXT will hold consultations with the three preferred universities listed in the applicant's Placement Preference Form and place the applicant at the university that approves the admittance as result of the consultation. However, should the applicant wish to enter either a public or a private university and not a national university, the applicant's preference order specified in the Placement Preference Form may not be met due to restrictions on the Japanese government's budget preventing the covering of higher tuition and other costs at such universities. Any objection by the applicant to the decision on the university placement will not be other costs at such universities. (4) If an applicant is judged by the accepting university, based on the results of the written language test given in the First Screening, not to have adequate Japanese language proficiency to understand lectures or research guidance for an institution designated by the university, the applicant will be placed in a Japanese-language training course at an institution designated by the university of placement or MEXT for the first six-month period after the arrival in Japan. Upon completion of the Japanese language training, the grantee will enter the university of placement for advanced education. However, if the grantee's record of achievement in the language course is poor and the grantee is judged to be incapable of receiving advanced education, the scholarship payment will be stopped. (5) If a grantee is deemed by the accepting university to have sufficient Japanese language proficiency to conduct his/her research, the grantee may directly enter the university of placement as a regular student or a non-regular student.

(6) Applicants will be notified by the Japanese diplomatic mission of the final results of the Second Screening and the

result of the university placement for successful candidates from November to February the following year. Any objections to the decision on the university of placement will not be accepted.

15. UNIVERSITY ENROLLMENT AND ACQUIRING OF DEGREES

(1) If a grantee desires to move on to a regular course for a degree from a non-regular student course, or to a doctoral course from a master's course or a professional graduate course, he/she needs to take an entrance examination administered by the relevant university and pass it. To continue receiving the MEXT scholarship after advancing to a higher level, the grantee must undergo another screening examination and be awarded an extension of the scholarship. (See "5. EXTENSION OF PERIOD OF SCHOLARSHIP.") A grantee cannot apply for an extension of the scholarship period while enrolled as a non-regular student.

(2) If a grantee desires to advance to a regular course for a degree from a non-regular student course, in principle, he/she must move on to the graduate school of the university at which he/she is studying as a non-regular student. If proceeding to the graduate school is deemed to be inappropriate given the grantee's major field or ability, he/she may be allowed to transfer to another graduate school, provided that, he/she is admitted to it.

(3) While the entrance examinations to graduate school vary depending on universities, assessment of the applicant's foreign language competence, grasp of the specialized subject for study, plans for the graduation thesis, etc. are

normally included.

(4) Under the educational system of Japan, a typical master's degree course lasts for two years subsequent to graduation from a university (i.e. after completion of a master's course. If a student has completed such a two-, or three-year course, obtained the necessary credits, and passed the final examination after submitting his/her graduation thesis, he/she will be granted the relevant degree.

(5) In the fields of medicine, dentistry and veterinary science, and pharmacy which is based on a 6-year course at a department or faculty, most of the universities offer only 4-year doctoral courses. For admission to such a doctoral course an applicant is required to have completed 18 years of school education. If an applicant completed 16 years of school education, he/she is required to have engaged for two or more years in research activities at universities or research institutions subsequent to completed 16 years of education, and to be deemed by a graduate school in Japan as being academically equal to an applicant who completed 18 years of formal education.
